

Simple Solutions for Making Your Home Lighting Dark Sky and Neighbor Friendly

Floodlights



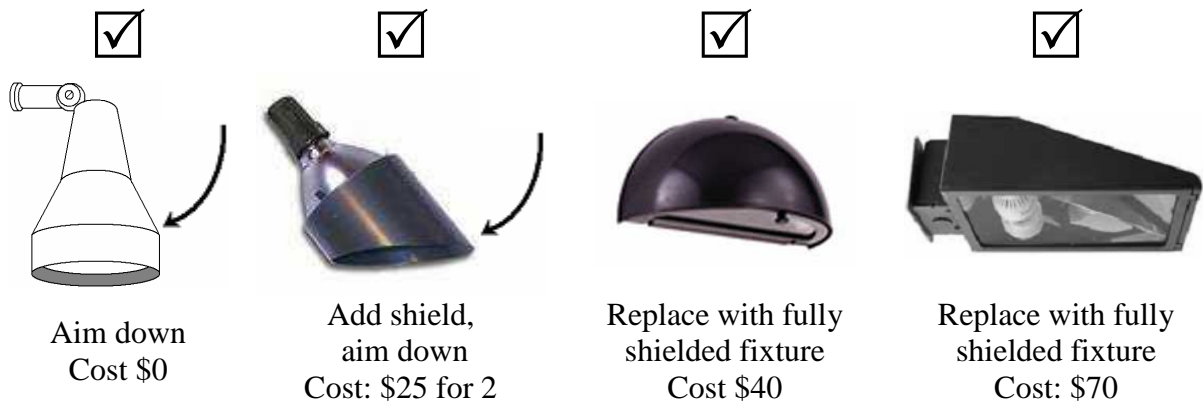
Fixture type: floodlights using R or PAR lamps, usually mounted on walls or roof eaves, sometimes with motion sensors*

Solution 1	aim fixture straight down [†]	R or PAR	25 – 75 W incandescent, 15W or less CFL
Solution 2	add shield and aim so shield opening is horizontal	PAR	25 – 75 W incandescent
Solution 3:	replace with fully shielded fixture	A, R, PAR	25 – 75 W incandescent 15 W or less CFL
Solution 4:	replace bulb with small (R20) reflector bulb.	R20	25 – 75 W incandescent 15 W or less CFL

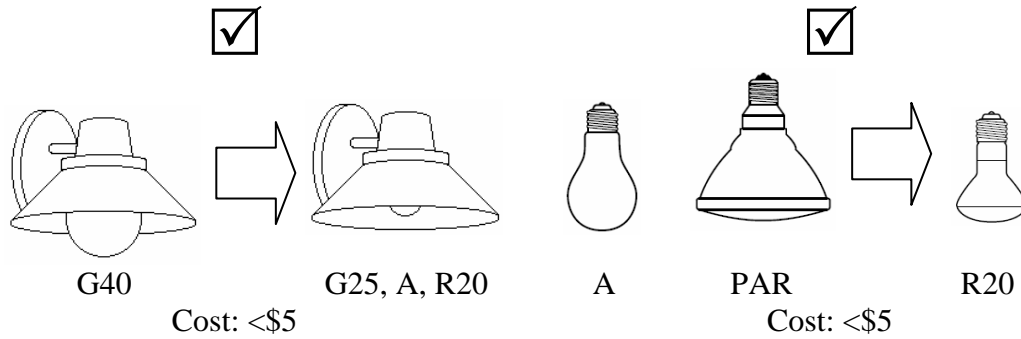
* Always adjust motion sensors so they “see” only areas near your house and don’t turn on for branches blowing or pedestrians walking by in the street. This usually means aim them downward as much as possible.

[†] Some fixtures cannot be aimed downward enough to prevent light trespass – these must be replaced.

Re-aim, shield or replace fixture



Replace with Smaller Bulb that “Hides” in Fixture
